Lighthouse tours...

Step back in time to feel what it was like to be a light keeper at Norah Head Lighthouse. Climb the 96 stairs and enjoy the 360 degree views from the Tower's balcony. Marvel at the optics prism and imagine polishing the 700 lens of the prism. Learn about the duties of a lighthouse keeper. Learn how the light was originally operated, compared to how it works today. Find out about signalling with flags and what each flag represents. Hear the stories of shipwrecks in days gone by.
